



Public Notice – Call for Applications Town of Victoria FireSmart Advisory Committee

The Town of Victoria was successful in securing **\$30,000** in funding from the **Department of Forestry, Agrifoods and Lands** to support the purchase of emergency evacuation kits, wildfire risk reduction initiatives, and community preparedness efforts.

As part of this initiative, the Town is inviting residents to apply for appointment as **one of four (4) public members** of the FireSmart Advisory Committee. This committee will take a community-driven approach to enhancing local wildfire preparedness. In addition to public members, the Committee will include representatives from Town Council, the Victoria Volunteer Fire Department, the Victoria Recreation Commission, and Town staff.


Some activities may involve light, hands-on participation. While safety will always be a top priority, working outdoors can sometimes come with a bit of dirt—and maybe the odd splinter. That's all part of the experience, and every effort will be made to ensure a safe and positive environment for all involved.
