Proxy

If you are unable to vote at the Special By-Election on Thursday, May 14, 2026, you may vote by proxy.

To vote by proxy means another qualified voter in the same municipality can vote on your behalf. A voter or their Proxy must complete a **Proxy Application** and return the application to the Returning Officer no later than 4:00pm on Wednesday, May 13, 2026.

A Proxy Application can be provided by the Returning Officer or found on the Municipal and Community Affairs website.

The Returning Officer will issue a **Proxy Certificate**. The Proxy presents this certificate at the polling location on Election Day so they can vote on behalf of the other person. Only one Proxy Certificate can be issued per person. You cannot be a proxy for multiple people.

CANDIDATE INFORMATION: Agents

Each Candidate may have one acting Agent who assists with campaign activities, attends the polling division on the candidate's behalf, and observes the counting of the ballots on the candidate's behalf.

A candidate can have more than one Agent who has sworn an Oath, but only one Agent can be present at any given time on Election Day.

An Agent **must** complete an Oath before assisting with any campaign activity which involves the use of the Voters List.

An Agent's Oath of Secrecy must be taken **before** 4:00pm on May 13, 2026 (the day before Election Day). Oaths cannot be administered on Election Day.

Oaths can be taken in person at the Town Office on:

April 28 between 10:00am and 2:00pm
May 5 between 10:00am and 2:00pm
May 13 between 9:00am and 4:00pm
