Meeting Conducted by A. Mayor Gordon M. Clark, All 5 Councillors in attendance.

Minutes of previous meeting read, questioned for errors or omissions, Moved for adoption was read on motion made & Seconded by Counc's Leo Clark & Leo Snook.

Business from minutes.

Question: Was Mayor Clark also resigned as Councillor? Ans. Yes, according to reply from a letter written

him asking to clarify this situation. Instructions were then given to inform the news media (radio stations) of Mayor Clark's resignation & also that Counc. Gordon Clarke had been appointed Acting Mayor, with Counc. W. J. Clark appointed as A. Deputy Mayor.

These instructions were moved, seconded & carried by Counc.'s Geo. Snook & Albert Powell. All in favor.

Mayor Clark then inquired if any Councillors had any business to bring before the table. However, at this point, Mr. Paul English, accompanied by Mr. Ross Taylor from the Dept. of Iowa Planning entered the meeting & all Council business ceased to give Council's attention to the reasons for these gentlemen's visit.

Mr. English discussed at some length the Pros & Cons of Planning the Town, both Residentially, Commercially & Industrially. He informed that the Town would be divided in zones, about 90% Residential Areas.

He proceeded to read a list of Regulations that the Council could adopt & accept as their future guide lines. In effect, Development Controls for the Town are now in effect & will be more clearly understood when Mr. English pays his next visit, at which time he will present a diagram outlining the zoning areas, which if put in effect will in-fill the Town residentially instead of extending to outside areas which will vastly increase Town's service expense.

All future applications for Building Permits must be accompanied by a set of specified plans depicting the type of building proposed & type of material to be used.

Jan 27. Councillors went to St. Johns to meet with Dr. A. T. Rowe & other departmental heads of Gov't to discuss Boundary line & lagoon for sewer intake as objected to by Town of Salmon Cove.

Jan 28/75 Meeting Conducted by A. Mayor G. Clark. Counc. Albert Powell absent through illness. Several guests attended.

Minutes of previous meeting read & questioned re. errors or omissions, none noted, Moved & ended by Counc. Geo. Clark & Geo. Snook that minutes be adopted as read, All in Favor.

Business arising from minutes. With reference to previous bill from Harvey & Co for labor & parts on Machine, Council had consulted with representatives from this Company, bill would be re-viewed & possibly re-processed to a lesser amount.

Re. Boundary lines, one reason why Council delegation had gone to St. Johns Jan 27th, Mayor Gordon Clark informed the gathering that they had met with Dr. A. T. Rowe & 8 other department representatives from various Gov't Offices. They made it known to those present

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that Victoria means to stand firm on the Boundary line which was drawn up when ^{Town Council} Council was first inaugurated & officially declared by Authorized Sources.

Dr. Rowe informed Council that a meeting with Salmon Cove Town Council & others concerned will shortly be held & if an agreeable settlement was not reached, the case would probably have to be settled by Arbitration.

MR. Paul English, who was also present & who has recently conducted a tour of the homes in the area in dispute reported that 8 persons had made known their preference to remain in the Town of Victoria, 3 in Salmon Cove & 1 neutral.

The Town of Victoria has now decided to refrain from further action until formal information is rec'd from Dr. Rowe or some other Authorized Source.

Mayor Gordon Clarke then addressed the present guests & inquired if they had any questions or problems that needed Council's attention. None forthcoming, except from Mr. Clarke. Discussions then centered around a variety of minor details, & it was revealed that out of 14 water resource testings done recently for the water running into Salmon Cove, all showed a high degree of pollution.

Council had been re-assured during their meeting in St. Johns that

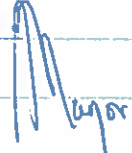
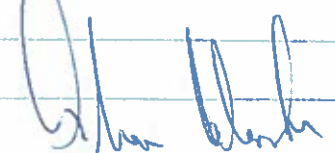
